## Standardised scoring for assessing applications June 2023 Version

The scoring system here is for guidance only. We're sharing it so that you can make an assessment of whether you think your application will get a high enough score to progress to our second stage, where our trustees vote on the applications. Typically around 40% of the applications we receive each quarter progress to our trustee stage. Applications with a score of over 39 have a reasonable chance of progressing. Remember that this is just a tool to help you. Whilst many of the scores are largely objective, some are more subjective - so our score might not be the same as yours. We won't enter into discussions with potential applicants / applicants about the scoring system or the score they recieve as part of this process.
